



The Birth of Cayucos, Part 2

When Mexico gained her freedom from Spain, she secularized all of the Missions of California. She took the missions away from the religious orders and gave or sold the lands to the public. It is from the vast lands used by the missions that the huge grants of land were made. Many soldiers who had served at the missions were demanding the lands which had been promised to them, and since Mexico wished to settle the land, the soldiers' demands were granted.

If the land was granted, the grantee was sent a paper of ownership by the governor. He was then put in possession of his lands by a Mexican official in a ceremony known as The Act of Possession. The land was measured in varas (2.78 feet) and was usually done by men on horseback. A measure of 40 varas was marked off on a hempen rope before the men began the survey. These land measurements were not always exact as the rope shrank or lengthened according to the time of day and the weather.

Three things had to be done in the first year of ownership. The grantee had to live on the land, he had to build a dwelling (usually a small adobe), and he had to improve the land. If these three requirements were not met, the grant could be withdrawn.
