



The Birth of Cayucos, Part 3: The Moro y Cayucos Ranchos

This original Mexican land grant was located between the present communities of Morro Bay and Cayucos and northward. To satisfy two applicants, it had been granted in two parts by Mexican Governor Juan Bautista Alvarado on April 27, 1842. The southern portion, identified as Moro, was granted to Martin Olivera. The northern part, Cayucos, was granted to Vicente Feliz. The Moro y Cayucos land grant covered 8,845 acres along the coast.

Feliz was a soldier in the Mexican Army stationed in Santa Barbara during the early 1830's. In 1836 he was mayordomo at Buena Esperanza Rancho. His wife, Felomena Valenzuela, died at the age of 26. He was left with four children.

In the 1830s, a Scottish seaman, James McKinley, was sailing along the California coast and acquiring large land holdings in this county. McKinley became a Mexican citizen, and married Carmen Amesti.

In the early 1850's, McKinley gained possession of both portions of the Cayucos y Moro Ranchos. The Mexican grantees were lacking capital, and they gave up the land in exchange for cattle and other goods. When McKinley died, the title became unclear. The boundaries were identified by landmarks which were indefinite, and the ownership papers were rather ambiguous. Nonetheless, Carmen McKinley and their children sold the rancho in a few large parcels. George Hearst, the father of William Randolf Hearst, bought three different parcels at the Cayucos end of the rancho between 1867 and 1869. By October 1872 Don Domingo Pujol was the owner of another large parcel.

On January 19, 1878 the California Supreme Court properly patented the title of this land to the McKinley heirs, so the sales became legal. Later that year, Chauncey H. Phillips purchased the Pujol section of the rancho. He subdivided it and laid out the town of Cayucos with a main street 100 feet wide and cross streets 80 feet wide. He sold the town lots for \$75 and ranches were sold for \$25 an acre.
