# Membership Report

Maggie Carlson of Los Osos is a new member. Lou Lahargoue of Morro Bay is a new lifetime member. Our membership chairman would love it if members would list their birth years on their applications. When a member turns 90, our officers award them with a lifetime membership badge, and they do not want to miss anyone.

### *The Birth of Cayucos, Part 4 The San Geronimo Land Grant and the Villa Family*

We now turn our attention north from the Cayucos y Moro Rancho to the San Geronimo Rancho which was located in the area of the present Villa Creek. It was granted to Rafael Jose Villavicencio in 1842 by Mexican governor Juan Alvarado. Arlene Villa Zanchuck, the great-granddaughter of Rafael Villavicencio, first related the following history at a San Luis Obispo County Historical Society meeting held in 1984 at the ranch of Mrs. Mary Hartzell.

In the year 1750, Rafael Villavicencio was born in Loreto, at the Presidio in Baja. His ancestors came from Spain. He was our great-great-great-grandfather. When he was 19, he was with Portola and Father Serra on their northward trek.

In 1773, he married a full-blooded Salinan Indian, Maria Ildefonsa Berges, at Mission San Antonio. They had eight children. Their second born was Jose Antonio Villavicencio. He was born in 1777 at Mission San Antonio. Jose Antonio was our great-great grandfather. He and his wife, Maria Serafina Espinosa, were the parents of 10 children. The second born from this marriage was Jose Teodoro Villavicencio. He would become the Mexican land grantee of Corral de Piedra in 1841 by Governor Pio Pico.

Their fourth born son, Rafael Jose Villavicencio, our great grandfather, was born at the Presidio in Monterey in 1803. He was the Mexican land grantee of the San Geronimo Rancho in 1842 by Governor Alvarado. He married Maria Ramona Armas in 1829 at Mission San Carlos. They were married 13 years before moving to San Geronimo with their five small children. The last three children were born near Mission Street in San Luis Obispo.

Our grandfather, Roberto, the third born in a family of 7, was born in Monterey in 1835. In 1859, he married Maria Guadalupe Higuera at Mission San Luis Obispo. Grandma Maria Guadalupe was the daughter of Tomas and Basilia Higuera, for whom Higuera Street in San Luis Obispo is named. She had 14 brothers and sisters.

When Roberto's father, Rafael, died, Roberto inherited a large part of San Geronimo. It is understood that it was our grandfather, Roberto, who shortened the name to Villa. Villa Creek, just north of Cayucos, is named after the family. Roberto and Guadalupe were the parents of 10 children, all born at the Rancho between 1863 and 1885, making 22 years difference between the oldest, Mary Villa Dughi, and our father, Frank Nicholas, the youngest.




