

#### **CAYUCOS HISTORY**

#### PART 6

The **Cosmopolitan Hotel** at the corner of Cayucos Drive and Ocean Avenue was the first lodging place in Cayucos built in 1875 at a cost of \$4,000. The proprietors, Morganti and Brignoli, declared in an advertisement that they had taken "great pains" to make the hotel equal to any in San Luis Obispo County. In 1879, Batista Morganti added a 50' x 24' hall to the rear of the building. This structure burned down in the disastrous fire of September 8, 1893. Morganti died at the age of 56 in December of 1881 as a result of a fight with Tom Righetti.

On November 20, 1880, George Stone, who had been the postmaster and innkeeper at Old Creek until the post office was moved to Cayucos in January, 1889, officially opened the **Exchange Hotel** at the northeast corner of Ocean Avenue and D Street. The next year he added a large livery stable, tank house, and a windmill. The facility proved so popular that an extension was added on the D Street side.

The Exchange Hotel was celebrated because it had the largest hall in Cayucos and, during the early years of the nineteenth century, motion pictures were shown in it. However, because the community lacked electricity until the 1920s, the power for the projector was supplied from generators of early day motor vehicles.
